The audited financial statements for FY 2024–25 have been completed successfully and queries answered. Statutory filings, including Form 10, Form 10B and the Income Tax Return, were filed within the prescribed timelines, ensuring continued compliance with regulatory requirements. We are in the process of compiling data for FY 25-26 and are in course for perfect compliance. The Income Tax Department initiated a faceless assessment for AY 2025–26. Timely online responses to notices are required through the e-Proceedings portal.

FY 2024–2025 was an exceptionally strong financial year for IACTS. The outstanding performance of IACTSCON 2025 significantly strengthened the Association's financial position and reserves and we now have a surplus of approx. ₹3 crores of which ₹50.00 lakh was invested in a Fixed Deposit (FD) in the name of IACTS. After completing the tax liabilities, we shall invest the same too.

Leadership and Entrepreneurship Development Programme



A brainchild of Dr. Satyajit Bose, himself an Alumnus of the Indian Institute of Management Kolkata, the course was organized by the IACS as an exclusive for our members! Some insights...

- A leadership course with a difference!

The IACS Leadership and Entrepreneurship Development Programme provided an insightful overview of the rapidly evolving healthcare landscape and the competencies required for contemporary medical leadership. Sessions highlighted emerging trends such as informed patients, artificial intelligence, workforce shortages, virtual care, and increasing financial pressures on healthcare systems. Participants were introduced to the Pareto principle and structured problem-solving tools including Fishbone analysis, Issue Trees, the Five Whys, and Impact Matrices to identify and address high-impact operational challenges. The programme also emphasized the behavioural and ethical dimensions of medical practice, discussing organisational justice, active listening, and the fiduciary responsibilities of physicians. Duties of loyalty, confidentiality, disclosure, avoidance of conflicts of interest, and good faith were contrasted with contractual obligations, underscoring the unique trust placed in doctors by

patients. Discussions further explored healthcare management from operational, marketing, organisational behaviour, and strategic perspectives, equipping participants with practical frameworks for effective leadership in cardiac surgical practice. Special thanks to Dr. Bose, President of IACS, for conceptualising, curating, and personally facilitating this enriching programme, which offered participants valuable insights into leadership, management, and entrepreneurship in healthcare.

Beyond the Operating Room: An Inspiring Journey into Leadership and Management

Clinical excellence has always been the hallmark of cardiothoracic surgeons. However, today's healthcare environment demands much more than surgical expertise. Leadership, strategic thinking, team management, and an understanding of healthcare systems have become equally important. Recognizing this need, the Indian Association of Cardiovascular-Thoracic Surgeons (IACS),



in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Calcutta, has launched the Entrepreneurship and Leadership Programme for its members.

The first module of this two-part programme, held from **25th to 27th June** at the Management Development Centre, IIM Calcutta, brought together **15 cardiothoracic surgeons from across the country**. Coming from diverse institutions and backgrounds, the participants shared a common goal—to become better leaders in healthcare.

The curriculum was thoughtfully designed to expose surgeons to concepts that are rarely part of conventional medical training. Sessions on **Hospital Operations, Public Policy, Ethics in Healthcare, Managing Self, Leading and Managing Teams, Strategic Thinking for Doctors, Legal Framework and Business Structure, and Analytics and Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare** provided fresh perspectives on the multifaceted responsibilities of modern clinicians.

The sessions, delivered by distinguished IIM Calcutta faculty, were highly interactive and thought-provoking. Through discussions, case studies, and group exercises, participants were introduced to concepts that are rarely encountered during conventional medical training. The programme challenged us to think beyond the operating room and appreciate the broader responsibilities of healthcare leadership.

Equally rewarding was the opportunity to interact with colleagues from different parts of the country, sharing experiences, perspectives, and solutions to common challenges. The programme reinforced the belief that leadership is a skill that can be learned and refined, enabling us to build stronger teams and more effective healthcare organizations.

As we look forward to the second module of the programme, we are grateful to IACTS and IIM Calcutta for this enriching experience. We wholeheartedly encourage more members of our fraternity to participate in future editions. The knowledge gained extends far beyond the classroom—it has the potential to transform the way

AORTIC REPAIR AND ROSS SUMMIT 2026

The Department of Cardiac Surgery, Sri Jayadeva Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences & Research, organized the Aortic Repair and Ross Summit 2026 at The Green Park Hotel, Bengaluru, on 5th and 6th June 2026. The summit was endorsed by the Indian Association of Cardiovascular-Thoracic Surgeons (IACTS). The primary objective of the summit was to promote the philosophy of “replace less and restore more” in aortic valve surgery. As Asia’s largest heart hospital, Sri Jayadeva Institute consistently strives to provide world-class cardiac care and surgical services at affordable costs for patients in need.

The summit served as a premier platform for academic and clinical exchange in the field of cardiac surgery. Conducted over two days, it brought together distinguished national and international faculty members to share their expertise and experience. Prof. Gebrine El Khoury and Dr. Bashi V. Velayudhan, stalwarts in their respective fields, along with leading national faculty, delivered insightful lectures on various surgical techniques, approaches, and personal experiences. A word from our Database Chairman

Dear Friends,

Greetings from the National Database Committee.

We have often lamented and bemoaned the lack of Clinical Practice Guidelines customised to our population. The reason is intuitive – we lack high-quality indigenous data to base our decisions upon. As a consequence, despite virtually an epidemic of phenotypically distinct CAD and high prevalence of RHD, high surgical volumes and results at par with the very best, Indian cardiac surgeons are yet to be acknowledged and acclaimed at a level, they rightfully belong, at the global stage.

Authentic and reproducible data, stored and preserved in a 'National Database', is the compelling need of the country. Moreover, given our diverse population and its socio-economic-cultural and developmental needs we need regional centres to collect and share their data, so that even regional imperatives can be identified and addressed.

In recognition of this major lacuna in our speciality, IACTS has put in place a formal team at Mumbai Office dedicated to this endeavour, 24X7. However, this 'National' project can only come to fruition through the indulgent support of all the stakeholders. Please join the bandwagon and submit your data to the 'National database':

- i. It is free.
- ii. It is simple, not more than 10 mins for each entry, and we would train and hand-hold you.
- iii. No need for extra infrastructure/finances/manpower - Your residents, Trainees, PAs, Perfusionist can enter the data.
- iv. It is safe – privacy and confidentiality are "Assured".
- v. It is "Beneficial" to you and your institution – For >1000 entries we shall present analysed data for you to use for monitoring, quality improvement, planning and resource allocation, and publication.

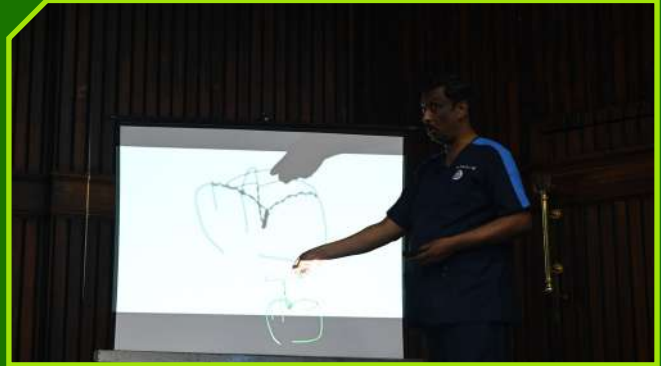

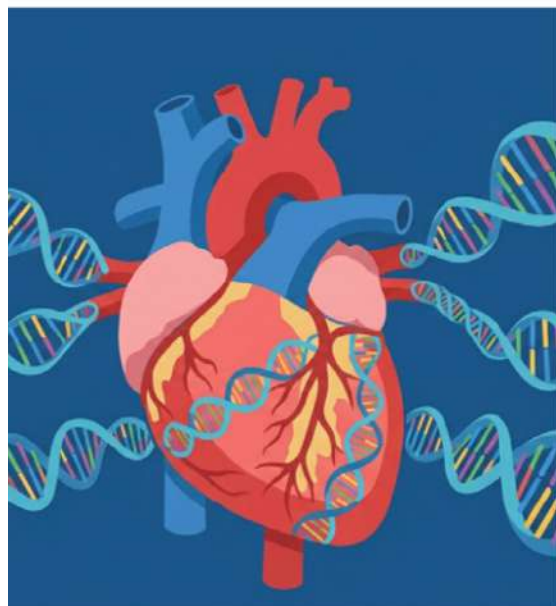
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IACTS WEBINAR

ALIGNING WITH GLOBAL STANDARDS:

WHY AN IACTS WOMEN CONNECT COMMITTEE IS THE NEED OF THE HOUR

As the Indian Association of Cardiovascular-Thoracic Surgeons (IACTS) continues to champion the highest standards of surgical excellence and academic leadership, our organization requires inclusive growth—ensuring every trained surgeon is empowered to reach their full potential. To achieve this, the formal establishment of the IACTS Women Connect Committee is a vital and timely step forward.

Global data reveals a persistent underrepresentation of women in cardiothoracic surgery, sitting at 8% worldwide and dipping to just 4% in South Asia. While India's total volume of surgeons has scaled exponentially over the decades, the proportion of female surgeons has remained historically stagnant. However, a major demographic shift is underway. An incoming wave of female talent is entering the field, with 42.9% currently at the resident and trainee stage. Crucially, 63.1% of these women are under 40 years old—a critical juncture where rigorous career timelines directly collide with major biological milestones.

Despite overwhelming personal passion driving their entry into the specialty, female surgeons face distinct systemic hurdles. Historical friction is real: 85.4% of women were actively advised against choosing CTVS due to their gender, and 51.6% report encountering gender-related challenges during training and practice. As careers progress, an institutional leadership bottleneck emerges, leaving 62.5% of women without academic or institutional leadership positions. This is compounded by a critical deficit of visible role models, with 58.6% of women surgeons indicating an overwhelming demand for accessible female leadership to guide the next generation.

In the contemporary global surgical ecosystem, providing structured institutional support for female surgeons is a decade-old, proven benchmark for academic excellence. *Women in Cardio-Thoracic Surgery (WiCTS) Committee (EACTS)*, *Women in Thoracic Surgery (WTS)-STS*, *Women in General Thoracic Surgery Committee (WGTS- ESTS)*, *Women in Thoracic Oncology Taskforce (IASLC)* are successfully integrated similar frameworks in their core architecture to support their members by focusing on mentorship and building diverse culture. Closer to home, peer surgical specialties in India have initiatives as *Women in GI Surgery and Liver Transplant (WIGIL- IASG)*, *Women in Neurosurgery (NSI) And Women of Urology (USI)*.

Under the direct oversight of the IACTS Executive Committee, a women connect initiative can focus on four pillars:

- **Mentorship Network:** Establishing a centralized network to break geographic isolation and connect junior trainees with established leaders.
- **Academic Development:** Encouraging research collaborations, publications, and clinical excellence.
- **Conference Representation:** Cultivating a steady pipeline of female speakers and panelists for national and international visibility.
- **Professional Support:** Addressing unique lifestyle challenges, career breaks, and work-life integration.

This initiative create a rising tide that lifts all boats. By offering targeted professional support, work-life integration strategies, and a centralized mentorship network, we break the geographic isolation currently felt by many young female trainees spread across the country.

Rear Admiral Dr Jeevan Mablur Borcar

Surgeon Rear Admiral Jeevan Mablur Borcar, VSM passed away on 29 May 2026 at Pune at the age of 80 after ailing for several months with age-related health problems. He lost his beloved wife Sulu several years ago & was living by himself in Mumbai. He is survived by his two sons, Nikhil & Amit, both of whom are in US. He graduated from Grant Medical College in 1968 and joined the Indian Navy. After the usual stint as Ship's MO, he was selected for training in surgery & got his MS from Pune University in 1974. After serving the Navy on board INS Vikrant and INHS Asvini as a Surgeon, he opted for Cardiothoracic Surgery and was posted to Military Hospital (CTC), (now rechristened Army Institute of Cardio Thoracic Sciences, AICTS) in 1979. He got his MCh from the same Institution and went abroad for further training at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Sydney. On his return, he was back in CTC. He was a dynamic member of the team and was instrumental in bringing Coronary Surgery to the Armed Forces Medical Services. He was one of the key Organisers of the 1990 Annual Conference at Armed Forces Medical College & CTC. He took an active part in operating, teaching, training, research, publications & future planning of the Department as well as running a successful M Ch Programme.. He headed the Dept from 1995 onwards. He was very popular among colleagues, staff and patients. He had a phenomenal memory & could remember patients by name during their follow up, surprising patients & colleagues alike. He was very sociable and was a part of many a noisy gettogether we used to have in the after duty hours. (The Borcar's were from Goa. His father was also a doctor & was in the Army Medical Corps. He taught Medical Jurisprudence at AFMC for some time.) We'll all miss the lively company of our dear friend Jeevan. May his soul rest in peace.
